## MANUFACTURING LOCATION

Manufactured in the USA means chairs are built from the ground up on American soil by American workers.

### The benefits:

- Shorter lead times
- Lower shipping costs (avoid tariffs)
- Easier warranty process
- Supports American workers

## FRAME STYLE & DURABILITY

If you buy durable chairs, you can have faith your chairs will last through many years of hard use.

### The benefits:

- Provide better return on investment
- Good for stacking and storage
- Powder-coated frames that resist scratches and dents
- Stronger warranty



## FOAM & COMFORT

Chairs with high-density foam seats and backs will be more comfortable and last longer.

### The benefits:

- Provides comfort for long-term sitting
- More solid and durable
- Prevents bottoming out

## SEAT & BACK CONSTRUCTION

The material used to construct chair seats and backs can impact many things. Typically, you'll have the choice between plywood and plastic.

### The benefits:

- Plywood is less expensive
- Plastic weighs less
- Plastic is more comfortable and easy to maintain
- Plastic can contour and provide additional support



## STACKING FOOTPRINT

Footprint refers to the amount of square footage a stack of chairs will take up. It's important to look for good stacking chairs with stack buttons.

### The benefits:

- Takes up less storage space
- Prevents damage during stacking and moving
- Works well in multi-use spaces
